EVACUATIONS

BEFORE an Evacuation

Have a preassembled "emergency go kit" of important supplies and an emergency contact standing by to assist you. Visit www.readyla.org for more readiness tips.

Evacuation WARNING

This alerts people in an affected area(s) of a potential threat to life and property. People who need additional time should prepare to evacuate at this time.

Immediate Evacuation ORDER

This requires the immediate movement of people out of an affected area due to an imminent threat to life. Choosing to stay could result in loss of life and impede the work of emergency personnel.

SHELTER-in-Place

This means the best place to be safe is indoors. Tune in to the TV, radio or internet for authorities to announce the threat has passed. Do not venture outside of your shelter area until you are instructed that it is safe to do so.

Prepare LA Now (PLAN)



PLAN is the City of Los Angeles' official emergency planning site for residents and businesses. The information you provide will create a customized individual, family, agency or business emergency plan. It's Free, easy to use and helpful to see all your information in one place. What is NotifyLA?

NotifyLA is a free mass notification system that alerts Los Angeles City residents, businesses and schools about emergencies. It lets them know what has happened, what government is doing and what action officials want individuals to take to protect their lives and preserve their

How does it work?

When an emergency happens, NotifyLA sends out a voice, text and email alert to impacted residents, businesses and schools registered in the system.

Although NotifyLA contains listed and unlisted landline phone numbers from telephone company 911 databases, it does not contain cell phone, VoIP or email addresses.

Individuals who want to receive alerts by text message, email and

What kinds of alert messages will be sent?

Information about emergencies, critical situations and, in some cases, preemptive warnings. Recipients are targeted by geographic location, so alerts will only be sent to those in areas impacted by the emergency such as evacuation, disaster and public safety notices.

What information is needed to register?

Visit NotifyLA.org. All that is required is a mobile number, home number, email, zip code and preferred language. When a disaster strikes in

Will the information remain confidential?

Yes, all information will be kept confidential. It will only be used for emergency purposes.
